In an effort to facilitate the documentation of dams throughout the State of Hawaii that may be altered or destroyed, the State Historic Preservation Division requests that petitioners present the following materials with their requests for determination.

Documentation will be determined by action undertaken

A lowering of the dam water level without physical changes in the dam will be considered "no effect" and require no documentation

Physical changes will require documentation.

Breaching of the dam in any form will require

General Architectural Inventory Survey including
Architectural Inventory Checklist

Architectural Inventory Survey (AIS) Report
including photo key

all layout drawings should have north arrow and *approximate* scale

USGS map

CD containing AIS in .pdf format

Same CD should contain all AIS photos in format acceptable to the National Park Service (see http://www.nps.gov/history/nr/publications/guidance/Photo_Policy_final.pdf). Additional photographs are also acceptable using the same standards.

Specific pre work photographs of areas to be changed with emphasis on cut stone, flumes, cemented ditches, tunnels, spillways, and other engineering features.

Measured drawings of cut stone, cement, or wooden features being altered. Copies of original drawings are acceptable.

Identification of potential impacts on identified historic resources found in the State Site List.
