- 1. Upon completion, will the proposed project result in a physical change of the geographical landscape in the area?
  - a. Yes. The dam will no longer retain water and the embankment will be modified by removing a portion of it and placing the excavated material on the upstream slope. A drivable concrete slab will be constructed and riprap will be placed within the breach section.
- 2. Upon completion, will the proposed project result in changes to the water flow frequency, volume, or path upstream of the dam facility, through the project site, or downstream of the project site? Include impacts during conditions such as severe storm events.
  - a. Yes. During storm events there will be changes to the water flow for approximately ½ mile downstream of the current dam location, as the dam will no longer attenuate the flow from the watershed. About ½ mile downstream, the flow reaches Kalihiwai River. Due to the timing of the peak flow from the dam watershed during a storm versus the timing of the peak flow from the Kalihiwai River watershed during the same storm, the removal does not cause an increase of peak flows of the Kalihiwai River during floods. Therefore, while there is some difference immediately below the dam, there is effectively no difference in amount of flooding downstream of the dam in the Kalihiwai river once this dam is removed.
- 3. Upon completion, is there a possibility the project may impact "valued cultural, historical, or natural resources in the petition area?"
  - a. No. Both a Reconnaissance Level Survey and a Historic American Engineering Record have been prepared for this dam as well as community engagement and input received by the dam owners during the design process.
- 4. Upon completion, is there a possibility the project may change public accessibility to the dam facility or surrounding area?
  - a. No. The design includes the construction of a new drivable access route across the bottom of the breach section to maintain access to the western side of the reservoir.
